Chesbro Reservoir is an **artificial lake** located three miles (5 km) west of **Morgan Hill, California**, in the United States. A 232-acre (94 ha) county park surrounds the reservoir^[3] and provides limited fishing^[4] ("catch-and-release"), picnicking, and hiking activities. Swimming^[5] and boating^[6] are not permitted in the reservoir.

History [edit]

The reservoir was created in 1955, 69 years ago by the construction of the Elmer J. Chesbro Dam^[1] across **Llagas Creek** in the valley west of **El Toro** peak. The reservoir and dam were named after Elmer J. Chesbro, a local doctor who was president of the Santa Clara Valley Water Conservation District (now the Santa Clara Valley Water District)

at the time.
